KRAKOW SUMMER QUANTITATIVE BOOTCAMP 2022

CONFERENCE STATUTE

("Statute")

§ 1 Date and Duration

- 1. This Statute defines the rights and obligations of participants of the Conference KRAKOW SUMMER QUANTITATIVE BOOTCAMP (hereinafter referred to as the "Conference"), which will be held from July 7, 2022, to July 10, 2022, stationary in Krakow on the premises of the Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science of the Jagiellonian University, at Prof. Stanisław Łojasiewicz 6 Street.
- 2. The Conference is organized by the Jagiellonian University, Gołębia St. 24, 31-007 Kraków, Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science, Institute of Mathematics (hereinafter referred to as the "Organizer"). Organizational and substantive support of the Conference is provided by the Financial Mathematics Student Association of the Jagiellonian University.
- 3. The Conference is held under the patronage of HSBC Service Delivery (Polska) Sp. z o.o. (hereinafter referred to as "Patron").
- 4. A participant of the Conference is an adult individual who has full legal capacity, is a student or graduate of a university, whose study profile is or was related to the themes of the Conference, and who, no later than July 6, 2022, reported a desire to participate in the Conference in the manner referred to in § 2 of the Statute and accepted the rules of participation in the Conference referred to in the Statute (hereinafter referred to as the "Participant").
- 5. Statute is available to Participants on the Conference website https://www.im.uj.edu.pl/ksqb (hereinafter referred to as the "Conference Website"), in Polish and English language versions, in a manner allowing its download.
- 6. Organizer reserves the right to change the Rules of Statute due to changes in generally applicable law and the need to adapt the Rules of Statute to this change, in particular to adjust the formula of the Conference to the restrictions, orders and prohibitions related to the introduction of a pandemic, changes in the program of the Conference, increase security measures accompanying the Conference. The amendment to the Rules of Statute will become effective within 7 days from its publication on the Conference Website. In relation to Participants who have accepted the Rules of Statute, the change will come into force within 7 days from informing them about the change of the Rules of Statute and from not objecting to this change within this period.
- 7. Organizer reserves the right to change the date and the formula of the Conference in the event that its implementation in the date and form referred to in paragraph 1 above will be impossible or excessively difficult due to reasons beyond the control of the Organizer, in particular, due to restrictions, orders and prohibitions associated with the introduction of a state of pandemic or epidemic emergency. Change in date and/or formula of the Conference will be immediately announced on the Conference website.
- 8. Organizer reserves the right to make changes in the conference program, including the right to change the time schedule and order of talks. In case of changes, the organizer will inform about it immediately on the Conference website.

§ 2 Registration for the Conference

- 1. Participation in the Conference is free of charge and requires prior registration through the registration form (hereinafter referred to as the "Form") available on the Conference website, in which a person wishing to participate in the Conference will be required to indicate the following data: name and surname, e-mail address, affiliation, major of study.
- 2. Details of how to register for the Conference and registration deadlines are provided on the Conference Website.

- 3. In case of resignation from participation in the Conference, a participant is obliged to immediately inform the Organizer about it by sending appropriate information to the e-mail address: ksqb@im.uj.edu.pl.
- 4. Organizer is not responsible for incorrect or false data given by the Participant during the registration of participation in the Conference.
- 5. The Conference is open to a maximum of 60 participants. The acceptance of an application for participation in the Conference is determined by the order of applications and a positive result of verification of a person interested in participating in the Conference in terms of meeting the participation criteria referred to in § 1, paragraph 4 of the Statute. The decision of the Organizer to accept or reject an application is final and does not require justification, people interested in participating in the Conference are not entitled to appeal. A participant will receive an e-mail from the Organizer with information about qualifying or not qualifying for participation in the Conference.
- 6. The limits of participants in the Conference specified in paragraph 5 above may change due to the epidemiological situation prevailing during the Conference and the related restrictions, orders and prohibitions. Organizer will immediately notify the change of limits on the Conference website. In case of the need to reduce the number of participants of the Conference, Organizer within available limits will re-qualify participants, taking into account the order of their applications. Organizer will inform by e-mail, Participants who will not be able to participate in the Conference due to change of limits.
- 7. Participant confirms reading the Regulations and acceptance of the provisions of the Regulations, which is tantamount to granting by the Participant the permits, licenses and authorizations referred to in the Regulations. Registration of participation in the Conference is made at the time of completing the data of the Participant in the Form and sending it by the Participant together with the consents referred to in § 5-7 of the Regulations, using the registration system described on the Conference website.
- 8. A participant acquires a place in the Conference upon receiving confirmation of registration.

§ 3 General Rules of Participation in the Conference

- 1. During the Conference, workshops and lectures will be held and presented (hereinafter referred to as "Lectures"). The Conference will be held in English. Detailed information and exact program of the Conference is available on the Conference website. The course of the Conference will not be recorded in the form of audio-video recording, nor photographed.
- 2. Participant, after the end of the Lecture, can declare a desire to ask questions by raising his hand. Organizer, taking into account the planned duration of the lectures, as well as the Conference schedule will decide on the number of questions and their content.
- 3. The Conference Organizer providing the Participants with the conference materials (hereinafter referred to as the "Conference Materials") pays particular attention to the need to respect the Participants' intellectual property rights. Participants agree to use the Conference Materials made available to them by the Organizer exclusively for their own personal use. Modifying, copying, transmitting, publicly reproducing and any commercial use of the Conference Materials requires the prior written consent of the Organizer or any other authorized entity. Participants shall be fully liable for any damages arising from their conduct contrary to the foregoing disclaimer.
- 4. Participants accept the established rules of the conference and its program and agree not to affect its changes and do not interfere with the course of the conference. Organizer is entitled to exclude from participation in the conference participants who violate the provisions of the Rules, in particular:
 - a) disrupt the Conference;
 - b) take actions that are unlawful, immoral or in conflict with the legitimate interests of third parties;
 - c) take actions to circumvent or indicate an attempt to circumvent the Regulations or rules of

the Conference;

d) take actions that violate legitimate interests of the Organizer or harm its image.

§ 4 Rights and obligations of the Participants

- 1. After arrival to the Conference, the Stationary participant is required to confirm his personal participation in the Conference at the reception desk in the designated area of the Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science UJ.
- 2. Participants are required to comply with safety rules, occupational health and safety regulations and fire safety regulations in force on the premises where the Conference is held, as well as the sanitary regime in force at that time.
- 3. Organizer is not responsible for items left or lost during the Conference and for items left in clothing or backpacks/bags/suitcases returned to the checkroom, as well as in other public areas of the Conference, Jagiellonian University.
- 4. Conference personnel in the event of disruption by the participant and public order and failure to observe the sanitary regime in force on the day of the conference are entitled to:
 - a) requesting the Participant to behave appropriately,
 - b) request the Participant to leave the Conference area,
 - c) call the appropriate authorities in a situation where the behavior of the Participant qualifies for such intervention, including, in particular, when it poses a threat to other Participants or staff of the Conference or property of the Organizer.
- 5. Organizer is not responsible for events arising from the failure of Participants to comply with the Rules and Regulations, failure to follow the recommendations of the Organizer and the instructions of the Conference staff and services responsible for security and order.
- 6. In order to ensure security on the Conference premises, the Organizer may use monitoring covering the entire Conference area, as well as its individual parts. The rules for the use of video surveillance by the Organizer are set out in Regulation No. 34 of the Jagiellonian University Rector of 16 May 2019 on: Regulations for Video Monitoring at the Jagiellonian University, as amended, available in the Jagiellonian University Public Information Bulletin.
- 7. In case of noticing a threat to the life and health of Participants, the Participant is obliged to immediately inform the Conference staff.

§ 5 Lectures

- 1. The Lectures will be delivered by Participants designated by the Organizer (hereinafter referred to as "Speakers").
- 2. A speaker is a Participant who has been asked by the Organizer to deliver a Lecture and has accepted this request, and until May 6, 2022, 23:59, at the latest, sent an e-mail to the address ksqb@im.uj.edu.pl with the title of the Lecture that he/she intends to deliver during the Conference. Further contact aimed at establishing the details of the speaker's speech will be made in a manner agreed upon by the Speaker and the Organizer.
- 3. Delivering the lecture as well as granting the Organizer permissions, authorizations and licenses referred to in § 5-7 of the Statute for using the lecture in the scope and on all fields of exploitation indicated therein is free of charge and takes place for statutory purposes of the Organizer.
- 4. Granting Organizer the permissions, licenses, authorizations, referred to in § 5-7 of the Statute, is voluntary, but necessary to present the Lecture.

§ 6 Copyright

- 1. The speaker takes full responsibility for the form and content of the Lecture.
- 2. The Speaker undertakes to develop and present his/her original Lecture and guarantees that the Lecture will not violate the rights and personal goods of third parties, contain theses and views advocating hatred or discrimination against any person on racial, cultural, ethnic,

- religious, philosophical or gender grounds. Moreover, it is unacceptable to promote in the content of the Lecture the ideology and symbolism associated with totalitarian systems, as well as the presentation of other topics prohibited by generally applicable laws.
- 3. If any part of the Lecture consists of legally protected elements to which the Speaker does not hold rights, the Speaker guarantees that he is entitled to use them to the extent necessary to deliver the Lecture and to grant the Organizer the license, referred to in this paragraph, without the need for the Organizer to obtain additional consents and permissions.
- 4. The Speaker agrees for a single public presentation of the Lecture to the Conference Participants, made by the Speaker in the place indicated by the Organizer.
- 5. The Organizer, upon the request of the Speaker and as far as possible, shall respect the Speaker's wish to be identified as the person delivering the Lecture. Furthermore, by delivering the Lecture, the Speaker agrees to make it available to the audience, i.e. Conference Participants, for the first time.
- 6. In the event that third parties make claims against the Organizer and/or entities acting on its behalf (hereinafter referred to as the "Entitled Entities"), having to do with the Lecture or its particular elements, the Speaker:
 - a) shall release the Organizer and/or Entities entitled from the claims in question to the extent to which it was obliged to acquire from third parties the rights to the legally protected elements of the Lecture, including the author's economic rights, the right to exercise derivative and related rights thereto and to individual elements thereof, as well as to obtain from them the permits and authorizations referred to in this paragraph; and
 - b) shall be fully liable for any and all damages suffered by the Organizer and/or the Entities entitled on account of any claims made against them under item a) above, including primarily, but not exclusively, damages relating to a claim for compensation for unlawful use of the Lecture or unlawful use of individual elements thereof.

§ 7 Processing of personal data

In accordance with Article 13 of EU Regulation 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter "GDPR"), Jagiellonian University informs you that:

- 1. The administrator of your personal data is Jagiellonian University, Gołębia St. 24, 31-007 Kraków, represented by the Jagiellonian University Rector.
- 2. Jagiellonian University has appointed a Data Protection Inspector, Czapskich Street 4, 31-110 Kraków. Contact with the Inspector is possible via e-mail: iod@uj.edu.pl or at telephone number 12 663 12 25 from Monday to Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- 3. Your personal data will be processed for:
 - a) to execute the agreement on participation in the KRAKOW SUMMER QUANTITATIVE BOOTCAMP Conference as well as to register participation in the Conference, i.e. on the basis of Art. 6 par. 1it. b RODO, on the basis of the agreement concluded by accepting the Terms and Conditions. The Conference organized from 7 July 2022 to 10 July 2022 by the Jagiellonian University: Institute of Mathematics will be held stationary.
- 4. Providing your personal data is necessary to conclude a contract, participation in the Conference.
- 5. Your personal data may be made available to entities entitled to receive them under generally applicable legal regulations.
- 6. The recipients of your personal data are entities providing IT and organizational support for the Conference.

- 7. Your personal data will not be transferred to third countries (outside the European Economic Area) or to international organizations.
- 8. Your data will be stored for the period of organization of the Conference and until the final settlement and closing of the Conference, as well as the statute of limitations for claims that may arise from the implementation of the contract referred to in paragraph 3(a).
- 9. Your personal information provided in the Registration Form will not be shared with any third parties.
- 10. You have the right to: obtain information about the processing of your personal data and your rights under the GDPR, access to and rectification of your data, and the right to have your personal data deleted from the controller's files (unless further processing is necessary for the performance of a legal obligation or in order to establish, assert or defend claims), and the right to restrict processing, data portability, object to processing in the cases and under the conditions set out in the GDPR.
- 11. To the extent that processing is based on consent, you also have the right to withdraw consent at any time without affecting the legality of the processing performed on the basis of consent before its withdrawal.
- 12. - 13. Your personal data will not be subject to automated decision-making or profiling.
- 14. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection if you believe that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR.

§ 8 Final provisions

- 1. This Statute is made available to Conference Participants on the Conference Website and enter into force on the date of their posting on the said website.
- 2. Organizer reserves the right to cancel the Conference. The Organizer will immediately inform about the cancellation of the Conference on the Conference Website. Organizer will not be liable to participants for any compensation or damages on this account, or to reimburse costs incurred to participate in the event.
- 3. This Statute has been drawn up in two language versions Polish and English, in case of any doubts as to their interpretation, the Polish language version shall prevail.
- 4. In matters not regulated herein, generally applicable provisions of Polish law shall apply.
- 5. All disputes shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Polish common courts competent for the seat of the Organizer.
