Rules and criteria for grading and passing  
**Topology** seminar (WMI\_DM.SEM.T i DM.SEM.T.L)  
in the academic year 2024/25

1. A necessary condition for obtaining a grade/entry other than 'NZAL' in the Topology seminar for a given semester is (full – 90-minute) attendance at more than  $\frac{2}{3}$  of all conducted classes. If this condition is met, entry 'ZAL' (or a positive grade – upon fulfilling additional conditions described below) is guaranteed. Individuals who, due to reasons beyond their control, may have difficulty attending frequently should report this immediately to one of the seminar coordinators.
2. Individuals whose study program for a given semester requires passing the seminar with a grade must give at least one lecture, which will be evaluated positively. The grade for the talk will, in this case, serve as the final grade recorded in the USOSweb system.
3. A necessary condition for receiving a positive grade is to provide the title of the talk, a brief summary, and – if the presenter will not be presenting their own results – the literature on which the lecture is based.
4. Individuals who choose or have chosen the seminar for the entire academic year but are only required to receive a grade for the seminar in the summer semester (i.e., the winter semester ends with an entry 'ZAL') may give their talk in either semester—their lecture will be credited toward the summer semester. Each talk can be credited toward only one semester. In particular, individuals who are required to receive a grade for the seminar in both semesters must give at least two talks during the academic year.
5. Individuals who are required to receive a grade in the winter semester must give a talk during that semester.
6. A seminar participant who is to receive a grade for the summer semester must have a date for their talk assigned no later than after the second meeting of the summer semester. A condition for the possibility of receiving a grade of 5,0 for the seminar is ensuring that the provisions of this point are fulfilled.
7. In a situation where, due to the fault of the seminar participant, it is not possible to assign a free date for them (e.g., due to a late request for a date), that person will give their talk in a time slot reserved for someone else, and the grade for the talk will be reduced according to the rule:  $\frac{2}{3}/\frac{1}{4}$  presenters = grade reduced by  $0.5/1/1.5$ . In such a case, the meeting time will be divided into equal parts—one for each presenter. Only the grades of those presenters who share responsibility for splitting one meeting into several presentations will be reduced.
