

Docquier-Grauert tubular neighbourhood theorem for admissible pairs (based on paper by Forstnerič)

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We shall consider *admissible* subsets $S \subset X$ of complex manifolds.

Definition. A subset $S = K \cup M \subset X$ is *admissible* if:

- (1) K is compact and has a Stein neighbourhood $U \subset X$ such that K is $\mathcal{O}(U)$ -convex,
- (2) M is embedded Stein submanifold of X ,
- (3) $K \cap M$ is compact and $\mathcal{O}(M)$ -convex.

A pair (K, M) is then called *admissible*.

We discuss the following

Theorem (Forstnerič, 2022). *Let $S = K \cup M \subset X, S' = K' \cup M' \subset X'$ be admissible sets in complex manifolds of the same dimension and let $F : S \rightarrow S'$ be a homeomorphism such that $F|_M : M \rightarrow F(M) = M'$ is biholomorphic, and with the property that F extends to a biholomorphism from a neighbourhood of K onto a neighbourhood of K' . Assume that there is a topological isomorphism $\Theta : \nu_{M,X} \rightarrow \nu_{M',X'}$ of the normal bundles, which is given over a neighbourhood of $K \cap M$ by the differential of F . Then, for any $\varepsilon > 0$ there are an open Stein neighbourhood $\Omega \subset X$ of S and a biholomorphic map $\Phi : \Omega \rightarrow \Phi(\Omega) \subset X'$ such that $\Phi|_M = F|_M$ and $\sup_{x \in K} \text{dist}_{X'}(\Phi(x), F(x)) < \varepsilon$*

We shall present its applications, and the main ideas and tools of its proof.
